

Design S8913 B / Hooded Pullover with Stripes



Double Cross Cast On: see Page 3.

Border Pattern: Knit 1, purl 1 ribbing.

Stockinette Stitch (St st): Knit on RS rows, purl on WS rows.

Gauge: 18 sts and 26 rows = 4 x 4"/10 x 10 cm over St st using size US 6 (4mm) needles.

Full-Fashioned Decrease: At beginning of row, k2, SKP (slip 1, k1, pass slip st over k1). At end of row, work to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2.

Stripe Pattern: In St st, alternate 2 rows in white, 2 rows in pink salmon. Repeat these 4 rows.

INSTRUCTIONS

Back: With pink salmon and US 4 (3.5mm) needles, cast on 64 (68, 74, 80) sts using Double Cross Cast On and work 10 rows (= approx. 1½"/4 cm) in Border Pattern.

Change to US 6 (4 mm) needles and work in St st for 14 (20, 28, 42) rows = approx. 2 (3¼, 4½, 6¼)"/5 (8, 11, 16) cm in pink salmon.

Then work in Stripe Pattern until piece measures 10 (11, 12¼, 14)"/25 (28, 31, 36) cm above border, or after 52 rows (= approx. 8"/20 cm) in Stripe Pattern. For the armhole shaping, bind off 4 sts at beginning of next 2 rows, work full-fashioned dec each side every 2nd row 5 times = 46 (50, 56, 62) sts.

After 70 rows in Stripe pattern have been worked, continue with pink salmon.

When piece measures 17 (18½, 20, 22½)"/43 (47, 51, 57) cm from beginning, bind off remaining 46 (50, 56, 62) sts.

Front: Work same as Back until 50 rows of Stripe pattern have been worked. For the V-neck shaping, leave the center 2 sts on a holder and working both sides at once, work full-fashioned dec at each neck edge every 2nd row 12 (13, 14, 15) times.

At the same time, after 70 rows of Stripe pattern have been worked continue with pink salmon.

When piece measures 17 (18½, 20, 22½)"/43 (47, 51, 57) cm from beginning, bind off remaining 10 (11, 13, 15) sts each side for shoulders.

Instructions are for smallest size with larger sizes in parentheses. If there is only one number, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: Schachenmayr Sun City, 300 (300, 350, 350) g #00224 pink salmon and 100 (100, 100, 150) g #00101 white.

From Milward one pair each sizes US 4 and 6 (3.5 and 4 mm) needles, one US 4 (3.5mm) circular needle 32"/80 cm long and one US 6 (4mm) circular needle 24"/60 cm long.

One yarn needle.

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Sleeve: With US 4 (3.5mm) needles and pink salmon cast on 31 (33, 35, 37) sts using Double Cross Cast On and work 10 rows (= approx. 1½"/4 cm) in Border Pattern.

Change to US 6 (4 mm) needles and work 14 (20, 28, 42) rows = approx. 2 (3¼, 4½, 6¼)"/5 (8, 11, 16) cm in pink salmon, and on the 1st row inc 6 sts evenly spaced across = 37 (39, 41, 43) sts.

Work in Stripe Pattern and for the sleeve shaping, on the 27th (27th, 29th, 31st) row = approx. 4 (4, 4¼, 4½)"/10 (10, 11, 11.5) cm above border pattern, increase 1 st each side, then rep inc every 10th (12th, 14th, 16th) row 3 times more = 45 (47, 49, 51) sts.

When piece measures 10 (11, 12¼, 14)"/25 (28, 31, 36) cm above border or after 52 rows (= approx. 8"/20 cm) in Stripe pat, bind off 4 sts at beginning of next 2 rows = 37 (39, 41, 43) sts. For the cap shaping, work full-fashioned dec each side every 2nd row 9 (10, 11, 13) times and bind off 2 sts at beginning of next 6 rows.

At the same time, after 70 rows of Stripe pat have been worked, continue with pink salmon.

On the following RS row, bind off remaining 7 (7, 7, 5) sts.

Total length = 15½ (17, 19, 21)"/39 (43, 48, 53) cm.

Hood: Sew shoulder seams.

With pink salmon and US 6 (4 mm) circular needle, pick up 64 (74, 80, 86) sts around neck edge = 19 (23, 25, 27) along each front neck and 26 (28, 30, 32) sts along back neck.

Purl 1 row on WS.

Mark the center 2 sts of back. On the following RS row, increase 1 st each side of the center marked sts and repeat inc every 2nd row 5 times more = 76 (86, 92, 98) sts.

When hood measures 9"/23 cm, decrease 1 st each side of center marked sts, work SKP before the marked sts and k2tog after the marked sts, and repeat dec every 2nd row twice more = 70 (80, 86, 92) sts. On the following RS row, bind off all sts.

Total length = 10"/25 cm.

Finishing: Block pieces to measurements.

Sew in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams. Sew hood seam.

For the V-neck and hood border, with US 4 (3.5mm) circular needle and white, pick up 136 (140, 144, 148) sts around neck and hood edge, beginning and ending at the center hood (at seam) and when working the center 2 sts at front from holder, knit these 2 sts tog = 135 (139, 143, 147) sts. Join to work in rounds. Work in Border Pattern for 3 rnds, and working the center front st as knit 1.

At the same time, on the 2nd rnd, decrease 1 stitch each side of the center front knit st = 133 (137, 141, 145) sts.

Work Italian bind off as follows: Next 2 rounds: Knit the knit sts and slip the purl sts with yarn in front.

Cut a strand of yarn at least three times as long as the border and thread strand through yarn needle.

★ Then insert needle from front to back, or from left to right, into the 1st knit st, leave st on needle and draw yarn through.

Then insert needle from left to right, or from front to back into the next purl st, draw the yarn through and leave st on needle.


Continue in this way, working from right to left, drawing yarn through the knit sts and purl sts and leaving them on needle, until all knit sts have been dropped.

Then working from right to left, insert needle through the purl sts and draw the yarn through.

Then drop the 2 sts - 1 purl st and 1 knit st - from the needle. Repeat from ★ until all sts are bound-off.

Sew in all ends.

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Cross Cast On with double strand


The cast on is worked with one single strand and one double strand.

The double strand must be at least twice as long as the desired length of the cast on.


Wrap the single strand (from the ball) over the index finger, lay the double strand from outside to inside over the left thumb and hold with the other finger.

Make a slip knot. For the **1st st**, lay the double strand around the thumb from outside to inside, insert the needle through the double strand from the outside (front) and around the single strand (see photo A). Draw the strand through to make a stitch.


For the **2nd stitch** lay the double strand from inside to outside over the thumb, insert the needle through the inner strand and draw through the single strand (see photo B). Draw the strand through to make a stitch.



A For the **1st stitch** lay the double strand from outside to inside over the thumb and draw the stitch through.



B For the **2nd stitch**, lay the double strand from inside to outside around the thumb and draw the stitch through.



C The finished cast on.

Alternate the 1st and 2nd stitches until the desired number of sts are cast on. Purl 1 row on WS, then work in the main pattern.

Tip: If you cast on tightly, then use 2 needles, if you cast on loosely, then use 1 needle.
